


Important Information Regarding eDAN v2

Discharge Clinical Summary

It is the doctor's responsibility to complete and sign off eDANv2s. However, other clinical colleagues have the option of adding specific, relevant, high-level information that they need conveying to GPs e.g. information regarding urinary catheters, PICC lines, wound care plans etc.

Contact Details

Best practice is to enter the direct telephone number of the ward the patient was on prior to discharge as well as details of who to contact in case of emergency e.g. GP, 111, 999.

Contact details
Please ring Ward x on 0113xxxxxx for advice following discharge. For any new symptoms or symptoms requiring immediate action please contact your GP, 111 or in an emergency 999.

Involvement
It is the doctor's responsibility to complete and sign off the eDANs but other clinical colleagues including nurses, physios, OT and dieticians do have the option of adding specific relevant high-level info that they need conveying to GP. e.g. information re urinary catheters, PICC lines, wound care plans etc.


Information given to patient
Examples: Nurse may use to advise patient 'Please contact GP in x days to arrange for sutures / staples removal'. Speech and Language Therapists use this field to share Swallowing Recommendations, ie: if thickener is required, advice on food consistencies swallow plan etc.

Patient Information

This section should be used to document key advice given to the patient including: driving restrictions, exercise, information for carers, whether the patient is immunosuppressed etc and should be written in a patient friendly manner.

Trust Actions

Best practice is for follow up appointments to be arranged prior to discharge and the details documented in the Trust Actions section of the eDANv2.

A copy of the eDANv2 should be printed and given to the patient at the time of discharge. eDANv2 are sent electronically to GPs in England. A copy should only be posted for GPs in Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland.
